NHS National End of Life Care Programme The route to success in end of life care- achieving quality in care homes	This strategy identifies the need for care home staff to receive training and support necessary to ensure provision of good end of life care. It sets out a staff development agenda including the publication of core competencies and principles for end of life care. It follows six steps: discussion as end of life approaches, assessment, care planning and review, coordination of care, care delivery, care in last days, care after death.	Click Here
